




Brian Batdorf | Service Dog Novak

This is war in the Middle East.

Amid this cacophony of chaos, Darren Godwin instructed CIA Special Operations Group officers to move with calculated precision and razor-sharp awareness. For 28 years, he never stopped moving. His distinguished U.S. Army and CIA service included months-long deployments, interspersed with brief returns home.

Eventually, Darren's spinal injuries forced a reluctant retirement—and two years in a wheelchair. "It's just depressing," he remembers. "You're constantly reminded that you're not capable of doing something.

You constantly feel like people are staring."

Service dog Coach bounded into his life, her high energy and unstoppable spirit instilling a new sense of capability and confidence. "Coach helps me walk; she keeps me balanced," Darren marvels. "She's go, go, go. She is so stinking smart. She always wants to work. Anything I ask her to do, she does."

Darren's renewed passion for life and training has led him and Coach to shine at dog training events and even receive an invitation to CIA Alumni Day.

Coach's impact is immeasurable. "I can't imagine not having her," he says with a smile.

"After a couple of falls, I knew this might be the right time to have a second set of eyes looking out for me. Peyton's the confirmation that allows me to keep going."






Lee Forbes | Levy Skilled Companion Dog for Military Families




Fred Jenkins | Guide Dog Banks


