

Coming home, life grew heavier. As a single dad, Patrick carried more than his own battles. He cared for his parents through their final days, endured the loss of his beloved dog, and watched his son move away. It was loss after loss.

"I was all alone," says Patrick. "Every day blended into the next. I didn't want to be around people."

That's when Miles found his place at Patrick's side.

Miles jumpstarts their mornings, breaking the cycle of sleeping through sadness. When anxiety creeps in, it feels smaller with Miles close by. He knows when to climb into Patrick's lap. When to break the spiral before it starts. Miles helps Patrick escape nightmares with a soft, gentle bark—a lifeline in the darkness.

"Miles is incredible," Patrick says. "I'm going places that I haven't been to in years because I just feel safe. It's unreal how different my life is. I'm alive again."





and then shortly after, the military. I ignored them for a long time, because my family was going through so much," Joseph says.


Reese came like a ray of sunshine. She's playful with their three children while offering peace and cuddles to Joseph and Medea—the best of both worlds.






